Goals

- 1. Differentiate instruction and assessment to meet the individual learning needs of all students
- 2. Provide learning experiences that are inquiry-based, and develop students' critical and creative thinking skills
- 3. Foster a growth mindset in all students
- 4. Prioritize the physical, social and emotional wellbeing of each student, while also developing critical social and emotional learning skills
- 5. Develop a classroom community based on mutual trust and respect
- 6. Utilize ongoing and authentic assessment that informs teaching practice
- 7. Establish multiple methods for ongoing and collaborative communication with families
- 8. Contribute as part of a dynamic team with the school staff





Key Classroom Entry Activities

Getting Informed

- Speak with the previous year's teacher(s)
- Read the students' OSRs
- Read student IEPs
- Collaborate with students to create detailed student profiles
- Run a few icebreakers where students can tell me more about themselves
- Conduct several diagnostic assessments for literacy and numeracy

Planning for Learning

- Create a detailed long range plan, looking for overlapping grade themes and spiral curriculum opportunities
- Establish routines for learning times where the two grades need to focus on different learning goals
- Create a class schedule that supports routine learning tasks as well as exploratory learning tasks
- Design learning tasks based on differentiated inquiry-based learning

Creating a Classroom Community

- Develop a co-created list of classroom rules, routines and norms
- Establish routines for celebrating student successes
- Establish an environment of trust and respect
- Speak with each student individually to get to know their likes, dislikes, interests
- Provide several methods for students to offer ideas and requests for their learning based on their interests, readiness, and learning profile
- Demonstrate respect for local activities and community events through classroom learning (i.e. Soapbox Derby)

Connecting with Families

- Send a newsletter home with an introduction to me, contact information for me, an outline of some of the learning this coming year, important dates, and other valuable information
- Create a classroom website, or Class Dojo, that allows communication with families (ensuring hard copies of all information are available for all families that do not have Internet access at home)
- Set up communication books/agenda for ongoing communication with home
- Call home regularly to each family to celebrate student success and discuss any concerns collaboratively

Classroom Set-Up

- Examine available classroom resources
- Based on information obtained about students, arrange an initial strategic seating plan
- Design bulletin boards and wall space to support key learning ideas

Connecting with the School Community

- Meet all school staff
- Ask about opportunities to get involved in extra-curricular activities
- Learning about the school policies and procedures
- Learn about what resources are available onsite, and what resources can be requested from the Board
